



On January 1, 2017, marijuana became legal in Nevada, but not just *anything goes*.

21+

You can possess and use retail marijuana if you are 21 or older.

If you're younger than 21, it's illegal.



1 ounce

You can possess up to one ounce of marijuana or 1/8 of an ounce of concentrated marijuana.



You cannot use marijuana in any public place.



You can only purchase marijuana from a state-licensed retail marijuana store.



You can grow up to 6 plants at home for personal use if you live more than 25 miles from a retail marijuana store. The plants must be out of public view and in a locked area.



If you are not the legal owner of the property, you cannot grow marijuana there without the owner's permission.



You can purchase, own, use, or sell marijuana paraphernalia (equipment, product, or materials used to grow, process, or consume marijuana).



You can give up to one ounce of marijuana or 1/8 of an ounce of concentrated marijuana to someone 21 or older, but only as a gift -- they can't pay for it.



Driving under the influence of marijuana is illegal and so is using marijuana in a moving vehicle.
